## VILLAGE MANAGER REPORT

The Village strives to provide its residents services in an efficient and effective manner. Briarcliff Manor provides a wide array of services and is always willing to evaluate recommendations to improve the manner in which services are provided to the residents. Recommendations are analyzed based upon factors such as cost, staffing and impacts on existing services. The Village has responded to recommendations in the past, which included the expansion of the recycling program to include the fifth Wednesday of the month (in those months with five Wednesdays) and increasing the budget for leaf removal to provide for more overtime to clear the streets of leaves by the end of December. There are other recommendations that have been received that are currently being evaluated.

## BULK HOUSING LAW

Public Hearing has been scheduled for January 8, 2007 at 7:30pm in the High School Auditorium, 444 Pleasantville Road

Amendments include, but are not limited to: eliminates increased setbacks and creates two standard setbacks based upon the Gross Floor Area (GFA) of a residence; requires landscaping; that portion of a deck greater than 1% of the GFA of a residence will be included in the GFA calculation; adds certain grandfathering provisions for existing homes built at previous minimum setbacks.

## Village of Briarcliff Manor and Stormwater Management

*Part of a continuing series of articles to be published in order to inform residents and businesses of the need to improve water quality in the Village of Briarcliff Manor*

**Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping** is the final of six (6) minimum measures designed to improve water quality in the Village of Briarcliff Manor. This program element relates principally to the municipal infrastructure and its associated maintenance programs. The Village must document its street sweeping, stormwater catch basin cleaning efforts and salt storage procedures. Plans must be developed for stormwater Management at the Public Works Facility and similar sites. The use of alternative products must be evaluated with respect to pesticides and other hazardous materials.

### REMINDER Village of Briarcliff Manor VILLAGE REAL PROPERTY TAXES

Village Real Property Tax Bills for 2006 were mailed at the end of May 2006. The First Installment was due by July 5, 2006. Penalties accrue on unpaid taxes each month that they remain unpaid. A penalty of 5% was applied on all unpaid balances as of July 6, 2006. Additional penalties will accrue each month the taxes remained unpaid.

#### The Second Installment is due by January 2, 2007
