VILLAGE MANAGER'S REPORT (914) 944-2782

The Holiday Season is here and many Villagers are decorating their homes. In order to ensure that every Villager is safe when decorating their home, this section of the Manor Monthly offers the following safety tips which have been provided by Con Edison:

- Make sure that holiday lights carry the seal of approval of a recognized safety testing laboratory such as an Underwriters Laboratories (UL).
- Before reusing electrical devices kept in storage, inspect for worn or frayed areas, particularly at the plugs and connections. Replace defective lights and cords. Throw out any frayed wires or extensions.
- Outdoor displays require outdoor, exterior rated extension cords, fixtures and bulbs. Install or adjust outdoor electrical displays only during dry weather.
- Avoid running cords under rugs, through doorways or near furniture where they may be stepped on, tripped over or broken.
- Do not place cords around or near metal pipes, appliance or anything that is damp or metallic. Turn off electrical devices when making adjustments.

PROPERTY TAX REMINDER

Village Real Property Tax Bills for 2010 were mailed at the end of May 2010. The Second Installment is due by December 31, 2010. Penalties accrue on unpaid taxes each month that they remain unpaid. A penalty of 5% will be applied on all unpaid balances as of January 4, 2011. Additional penalties will accrue each month the taxes remained unpaid.

The payment coupon for the Second Installment is attached to the bills that were mailed in May – **no additional bills will be mailed.**

DOG LICENSING CHANGES

Effective January 1, 2011 the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets will no longer provide the Village with Dog Licensing services. Governor Patterson signed into law in June Part T of Chapter 59 of the Laws of 2010 providing for the elimination of NYSDAM's dog licensing functions, including the agency's centralized Dog Licensing System (DLS). This also includes sending renewal notices to all licensed dog owners and providing the Village with dog identification tags.

HOW DOES THIS AFFECT YOU AS THE DOG OWNER?

The Board of Trustees recently adopted a local law to memorialize the State's requirements and adopted a new fee schedule effective January 1, 2011.

The Village Clerk's Office will:

- Create and distribute a new dog license application to all license holders
- Distribute all renewal applications, notices and reminders to all license holders.
- Issue a new dog identification tag to every licensee.
- Maintain a database of all licensed dogs

WHAT DOGS SHOULD BE LICENSED?

Pursuant to Article 7 of New York State Agriculture and Markets Law:

Every dog, regardless of age, owned or harbored in the Village for longer than 30 days must be licensed .

The following are the **only license exemptions**:

- if the dog is under four months of age and not running-at-large (off the owner's premises)
- if a non-resident brings a dog into the Village for less than 30 days and the dog is licensed according to the resident state's licensing laws.

HOW DO I LICENSE MY DOG?

Apply by mail or in person using the application available on the Village website www.briarcliffmanor.org or at Village Hall.

In addition to the application the owner will need:

- if the dog is spayed or neutered - a certificate from a licensed veterinarian or an affidavit from the owner showing that the dog has been spayed or neutered, unless this proof is already on file with the clerk;
- ALL dogs three months or older must have proof of a **rabies vaccination** signed by a licensed veterinarian or a certificate stating why the life of the dog would be endangered by the vaccine; and
- a check payable to the Village of Briarcliff Manor for the appropriate license fee.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT**(914) 944-2770****HOME HEATING SAFETY TIPS**

Heating equipment is among the leading causes of home fires nationally and in New York State. Very often heating related fires are the result of a lack of maintenance or simple acts of carelessness. Following the guidelines below will help to ensure that you reduce the possibility of experiencing a heating related fire.

Proper Maintenance and an annual inspection of furnaces, space heaters, wood stoves, fireplaces, chimneys and chimney connections by qualified specialists can prevent fires and save lives. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for installation, venting, fueling, maintenance and repair. Review the owner's manual to make sure you remember the operating and safety features.

- ⇒ **Space Heaters**—When using portable heaters, do not place them where it is possible for small children or pets to fall against them and receive a contact burn. Avoid the use of extension cords with electric heaters. Always turn off space heaters before leaving the room or going to bed.
- ⇒ **Fuel Burning Appliances**—When taking a heater out of storage in the fall, install batteries and inspect the shut off mechanism and wick for proper operation. Fill the tank with fresh fuel. Let the heater cool down before refueling. Adding fuel to a hot heater can start a dangerous fire.
- ⇒ **Wood Burning Appliances and Fireplaces**—Do not burn trash in the wood stove or fireplace. Burn only well-seasoned hardwoods. Be sure the fire you build fits your fireplace or stove, don't overload it. Be sure wood stoves are installed at least 36 inches away from the wall. Keep combustible material well away from the fireplace, stove and chimney. Keep the area around them clean. Always use a fireplace screen to prevent sparks from leaving the fireplace and starting a fire. Never leave a fire unattended.
- ⇒ **Chimneys**—Creosote accumulation is the leading cause of chimney fires. A chimney that is dirty, blocked or is in disrepair can inhibit proper venting of smoke up the flue and can also cause a chimney fire. Nearly all residential fires originating in the chimney are preventable. An annual chimney inspection by a qualified chimney sweep can prevent fire or carbon monoxide poisoning.
- ⇒ **Ashes**—Keep wood stoves and fireplaces free of excess ash buildup. Excessive ash buildup prevents good circulation of air needed for combustion. When removing ashes, use a metal container with a tight-fitting cover. Always place ashes in an outside location away from structures. Ashes that seem cool may contain a smoldering charcoal that can start a fire.

RECYCLING RULES & REGULATIONS

BRUSH: Branches must be less than 6" in diameter and cut to 5' or less in length and TIED. Small loose brush must be placed in paper bags for curbside pickup on Recycle Wednesday.

CELL PHONES: contain a number of dangerous toxic materials that should be kept out of the waste stream. Westchester County passed a cell phone recycling law making it illegal to throw the phones in the garbage. Cell phones may be recycled in the *Verizon Wireless HopeLine* Collection Box located at the Department of Public Works. For your security, personal information stored in cell phones dropped in this collection box will be erased.

CO-MINGLE RECYCLING: Containers (glass, metal and plastic) can be co-mingled in one bin. Place material in an open container for pickup (maximum size - 32 gallons). Blue 14 or 22 gallon recycling containers are available for purchase at DPW for \$12.

GLASS: Recyclable Clear or colored glass that did contain food or beverage. Please rinse out all containers and **DO NOT INCLUDE CAPS OR LIDS. Not Recyclable:** Broken glass, china, crystal, glassware, pottery, ceramics, pyrex, light bulbs, fluorescent light bulbs, broken glass mirror, glass containing lead, such as auto and window glass, pesticide/herbicide containers, or any non-food or non beverage containers.

METAL: Recyclable – Food cans, beverage cans, aerosol cans, metal lids/caps aluminum pie tins, trays and foil wrap. All metals should be clean and free of food. No need to remove labels. **Not Recyclable:** Oil and paint cans, metal clothing hangers, and containers labeled toxic or corrosive.

NEWSPAPER, GREY CARDBOARD & OTHER PAPER: Recyclable – All newspaper, including glossy inserts, junk mail, envelopes, office waste paper, magazines, phone books, stapled and glued catalogs, paper with crayon, brown paper bags and grey cardboard such as cereal/tissue boxes, toilet & paper towels rolls and flattened corrugated cardboard boxes. Material should be tied, placed in blue bin/cardboard or brown paper bags. **Not Recyclable:** Books, wrapping paper, painted paper and carbon paper and plastic grocery bags.

OIL, ANTI-FREEZE & BATTERIES: Recyclable – Used motor oil and anti-freeze – **MAY BE DROPPED OFF AT DPW GARAGE** **Not Recyclable:** Cooking oil. Most small batteries, such as flashlight can be disposed with your regular household garbage.

PLASTIC: #1 and #2 Recyclable Only Please rinse out all containers and **DO NOT INCLUDE CAPS OR LIDS. Not Recyclable:** Plastic bags, polystyrene products, such as foam cups, plates & packing material, plastic utensils, clear plastic wraps and bags, food wrappers, plastic flower pots, toys, or hazardous containers, such as motor oil containers or pesticide containers. Westchester County accepts plastic bags for recycling at Household Recycling Days. In addition, many stores have established an in-store Plastic Bag Collection and Recycling Program, placing receptacles near or at the entrance to the store.

BULK METAL MUST BE SCHEDULED FOR PICKUP ON RECYCLE WEDNESDAY

(i.e. *E-Waste items, grills, lawn mowers, metal fencing, pipes, small TV's etc.). Some items may require a fee/permit (Refrigerator, Freezer, Dehumidifier, A/C, Washer, Dryer, Treadmill, Large TV's, etc.)

***E-WASTE:** computer monitors, TVs, VCRs, computer towers & accessories, printers, faxes, phones, small appliances, i.e. toasters, blenders, radios, stereos, speakers, lamps.

\$30 PERMIT REQUIRED FOR THE FOLLOWING:

FREON FILLED APPLIANCES: Air conditioners, Freezers, Refrigerators, and Dehumidifiers

BULK METALS: Large Appliances, (*Washer, Dryer, Stove, Hot Water Heater, etc.*) Grills, Metal Furniture, Metal Doors, File Cabinets, Lawn Equipment/Mowers and Large quantities of Aluminum Siding, Metal Pipes, Sheet Metal, Wire Fencing, etc.
