PROPERTY TAX REMINDER

Village Real Property Tax Bills for 2014 were mailed at the end of May 2014. The Second Installment is due by December 31, 2014. Penalties accrue on unpaid taxes each month that they remain unpaid. A penalty of 5% will be applied on all unpaid balances as of January 1, 2015. Additional penalties will accrue each month the taxes remain unpaid. The Village Tax Office is closed January 1st and 2nd and the drop box will be sealed at midnight on December 31st.

DOG LICENSING

HOW DO I LICENSE MY DOG?

Apply by mail or in person using the application available on the Village website www.briarcliffmanor.org or at Village Hall.

In addition to the application the owner will need:

- if the dog is spayed or neutered - a certificate from a licensed veterinarian or an affidavit from the owner showing that the dog has been spayed or neutered, unless this proof is already on file with the clerk;
- ALL dogs three months or older must have proof of a **rabies vaccination** signed by a licensed veterinarian or a certificate stating why the life of the dog would be endangered by the vaccine; and
- a check payable to the Village of Briarcliff Manor for the appropriate license fee.

WHAT DOGS SHOULD BE LICENSED?

Pursuant to Article 7 of New York State Agriculture and Markets Law:

Every dog, regardless of age, owned or harbored in the Village for longer than 30 days must be licensed . The following are the **only license exemptions**:

- if the dog is under four months of age and not running-at-large (off the owner's premises)
- if a non-resident brings a dog into the Village for less than 30 days and the dog is licensed according to the resident state's licensing laws.

HOME HEATING SAFETY TIPS

Heating equipment is among the leading causes of home fires nationally and in New York State. Very often heating related fires are the result of a lack of maintenance or simple acts of carelessness. Following the guidelines below will help to ensure that you reduce the possibility of experiencing a heating related fire.

Proper Maintenance and an annual inspection of furnaces, space heaters, wood stoves, fireplaces, chimneys and chimney connections by qualified specialists can prevent fires and save lives. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for installation, venting, fueling, maintenance and repair. Review the owner's manual to make sure you remember the operating and safety features.

- ⇒ **Space Heaters**—When using portable heaters, do not place them where it is possible for small children or pets to fall against them and receive a contact burn. Avoid the use of extension cords with electric heaters. Always turn off space heaters before leaving the room or going to bed.
- ⇒ **Fuel Burning Appliances**—When taking a heater out of storage in the fall, install batteries and inspect the shut off mechanism and wick for proper operation. Fill the tank with fresh fuel. Let the heater cool down before refueling. Adding fuel to a hot heater can start a dangerous fire.
- ⇒ **Wood Burning Appliances and Fireplaces**—Do not burn trash in the wood stove or fireplace. Burn only well-seasoned hardwoods. Be sure the fire you build fits your fireplace or stove, don't overload it. Be sure wood stoves are installed at least 36 inches away from the wall. Keep combustible material well away from the fireplace, stove and chimney. Keep the area around them clean. Always use a fireplace screen to prevent sparks from leaving the fireplace and starting a fire. Never leave a fire unattended.
- ⇒ **Chimneys**—Creosote accumulation is the leading cause of chimney fires. A chimney that is dirty, blocked or is in disrepair can inhibit proper venting of smoke up the flue and can also cause a chimney fire. Nearly all residential fires originating in the chimney are preventable. An annual chimney inspection by a qualified chimney sweep can prevent fire or carbon monoxide poisoning.
- ⇒ **Ashes**—Keep wood stoves and fireplaces free of excess ash buildup. Excessive ash buildup prevents good circulation of air needed for combustion. When removing ashes, use a metal container with a tight-fitting cover. Always place ashes in an outside location away from structures. Ashes that seem cool may contain a smoldering charcoal that can start a fire.

RECYCLING RULES & REGULATIONS

ORGANIC WASTE

BAGGED LEAVES & GRASS CLIPPINGS: Bagged leaves at curbside are picked up from April 1st to November 1st, on your Recycle Wednesday. You must use brown paper bags only: no cardboard boxes, plastic bags, etc. From November 1st to January 1st, your bagged leaves will be picked up during the Village's bulk leaf pick-up program, (not on your recycle Wednesday). From January 1st to February 1st, bags will be picked up only on your Recycle Wednesday. No bags will be picked up from February 1st to April 1st.

BULK LEAVES: Bulk leaf pick up at the curbside starts about October 15th and ends on January 1st: this is seasonal based on the leaf drop. Bulk leaves (including bagged leaves), must be placed within the Village's Right Of Way (usually the first 10 feet from the road edge): not in the road. We cover the Village in a series of several laps, each taking between two to three weeks to complete. We do not respond to scheduling requests: and continue pick up until complete. Do not mix sticks or brush with leaves. Once the final lap is complete, bulk leaf pick up kicks into the schedule for bagged leaves, above. You can also drop off leaves at DPW or provide a note for your landscaper to drop them off on your behalf.

BRUSH: Branches must be less than 6" in diameter and cut to 5' or less in length and TIED in manageable bundles. Small loose brush must be placed in paper bags for curbside pick up on Recycle Wednesday. Brush pick-up will be suspended annually from November 1st to January 1st. Brush will be picked up with Christmas trees in January and suspended from February 1st, until April 1st.

LOGS: Logs and brush in excess of 6" diameter and longer than 5' **will not** be picked up. You will have to make other arrangements for disposal.

CHRISTMAS TREES: Christmas trees are picked up from January 1st to February 1st at the curbside on your Recycle Wednesday.

NOTE: All organic waste material meeting the above criteria can be dropped off by you or your landscaper (with a note from you) at the DPW yard at 10 Buckhout Road, all year, Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Residents and landscapers must sign in at the DPW office.

RECYCLING RULES & REGULATIONS CONTINUED

COMINGLE MATERIALS (CANS, BOTTLES, PLASTIC CONTAINERS): Will be picked up on your Recycle Wednesday. Comingle material must be placed curbside in a container no larger than 32 gallons.

PAPER AND CARDBOARD MATERIALS: Will be picked up on your Recycle Wednesday. Paper must be placed curbside and in a container (No larger than 14 gallons), or in a small cardboard box, paper bags or in small tied bundles.

PAINT: Paint in cans must be hardened prior to disposal. Open cans and harden paint by one of these methods: Kitty litter, Speedy dry absorbent or Waste paint hardener. Leave lids off and dispose of dried cans in a garbage bag placed at the curb on your garbage pick-up day.

METAL/ELECTRONIC E-WASTE: All metal and e-waste will be picked up **Only by Appointment** on your Recycle Wednesday. Bulk metal or large e-waste items require a \$30.00 fee for pick up. The \$30.00 fee will be waived if these items are transported to the D.P.W. for disposal by the resident.

OTHER RECYCLABLE ITEMS NOT PICKED UP OR ACCEPTED BY D.P.W.

Plastic Bags: Take plastic bags to a local grocery store.

Motor Oil: Take to a service station (free up to 5 gallons per person).

Vehicle Batteries: Take to retailer who sells them (Free up to 2 vehicle batteries per person).

Tires: Take to retailer who sells them (they charge a nominal fee), or H-MRF up to 4 allowed.

Propane tanks: Take to retailer who sells them (they charge a nominal fee), or H-MRF.

Fluorescent/CFL bulbs: Take to Home Depot or H-MRF.

Automotive Fluids: (Antifreeze, brake fluid, etc.), take to H-MRF, no motor oil.

Chemicals: Take to H-MRF.

Stains: Take to H-MRF.

Fire Extinguishers: Take to H-MRF.

WINTERIZING YOUR LAWN SPRINKLER SYSTEM

Make sure that you or your plumber drains your lawn sprinkler system for the year. Compressed air should be used to “blow out” water that could be lying in the piping. Water lying in the “saddle” of the system, could expand causing undetectable leaks. When you re-energize your sprinkler, you should test the system. Turn off all water use in the house; turn on the sprinkler service valve but do not activate the timer or moisture actuator. Thereafter, a quick check of your water meter may show water running. If it does, your sprinkler system may have been damaged...potentially causing a huge leak.
